

- IS YOUR FAMILY TEMPORARILY STAYING IN:

hool district's McKinney-Vento Coordinator may be able to help

If your family is staying in these living situations, your children have the right to receive extra services and supports in school under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act. These include:

- Staying in the same school, even if you move, and Staying in the same school, even if you move, and receiving free transportation to and from that school if it is in your best educational interest to stay Immediate enrollment, even if you don't have the documents that are typically required for enrollment Receiving free school meals
- Connecting younger children to early childhood
