

## **KNOW YOUR RIGHTS**



The McKinney-Vento Act



#### IS YOUR FAMILY TEMPORARILY STAYING IN:

- someone else's house or apartment due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason?
- a hotel or motel?
- a shelter?
- a car, park, campground, abandoned building, or other inadequate space?

Your local school district's McKinney-Vento Coordinator may be able to help!

If your family is staying in these living situations, your children have the right to receive extra services and supports in school under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act. These include:

- Staving in the same school, even if you move, and receiving free transportation to and from that school if it is in your best educational interest to stay
- · Immediate enrollment, even if you don't have the documents that are typically required for enrollment
- Receiving free school meals
- Connecting younger children to early childhood services
- College readiness assistance for high school students
- Referrals to the community for help with other needs

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES: Food Assistance During the Government Shutdown

If you or your family are worried about food during the government shutdown, help is available.

School Meals will Remain Available for All Students
 All students can still get free breakfast and lunch at school every day.

### • Find Local Food Assistance

### General Assistance

### Continue to Apply or Renew SNAP Benefits
