# **PICTURE RETAKES - December 3rd**

FOR RETAKES: There may be students that didn't like their original photo from Fall Picture Day. That's ok! They can take a complimentary retake on Makeup Picture Day. We ask that these students bring their original, unwanted prints to the photographer on Makeup Picture Day. This serves 2 main purposes: a. The prints act as an identifier to their teacher that that student needs to be sent down to the photographer. b. It lets the photographer see what exactly wasn't liked about the Fall image, to help make the retake image even better. The students will be invited to review their retake image at the camera and can retake it again if needed until they like their retake image. For retakes of a Fall photo: families will not need to place a new order - we will produce a complimentary reprint of whatever products they originally purchased but now using the new retake image.
