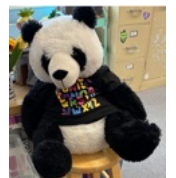
REGISTRATION IS OPEN
Pre-K, Kindergarten and New Students

Registration is done on-line at rsu40.org

A child must be four years old on or before October 15, 2026, to be eligible to register for Pre-K and must be five years old on or before October 15, 2026, to be eligible to register for Kindergarten. If your child was enrolled in the district for Pre-K, you do not need to do a new registration for enrollment for Kindergarten. You will need to do the annual update of Student Information in the fall.
