### **NWEA Through Year Assessment Results**

Spring NWEA Information - Although you will find information regarding Spring '23 NWEA data as compared to Fall '22 NWEA data, the reader should be aware that both validity and reliability should be challenged. Last spring's NWEA was a Through Year assessment which served as the Maine Education Assessments for math and reading. The questions do not adjust depending on right or wrong answers like the traditional NWEAs, but rather represent a summative assessment or "final exam" for the year. Because it's two different types of tests it's difficult to draw hard conclusions. Moving forward, we will use spring of '24's data to measure growth as compared to spring of '23's data. These are similar tests which make it much more valid and reliable.

- Other factors or variables the reader should also be aware of include:
  - Many times high achieving students don't reach their growth goal, because their RIT score is already so high. The margin for error becomes very small.
  - NWEAs, especially the ThroughYear Assessment, is as much an exercise in grit and perseverance as much as it is a tool designed to measure proficiency. A student must sustain a high level of effort for 60 plus minutes per assessment.
  - Students in special education have Individualized Education Plans with goals and objectives which are used to measure their growth, not NWEAs.
