A Friendly Reminder from the Knox County Sheriff's Department

A Deputy from the Knox County Sheriff's Department came last week and performed random car safety checks to ensure all parents were following the law regarding child vehicle safety laws. The Deputy wanted our school to provide parents with a friendly reminder of these laws designed to keep our youth safe. Most cars met criteria outlined in these laws, however we did have a few people who required reminders. The Deputy mentioned that tickets/fines will be issued in the future. These laws will be strictly enforced to keep children safe.

Here is what the law states:

The operator shall ensure that a child who weighs less than 80 pounds, who is less than 57 inches in height and who is less than 8 years of age is properly secured in a belt positioning seat or other child restraint system in accordance with the child restraint system manufacturer's instructions and the vehicle manufacturer's instructions. [PL 2019, c. 577, §4 (AMD).] (This means your child may fit in a car seat or a booster seat, but is not tall, weigh, or old enough to sit in a seat without these safety seats).

The operator shall ensure that a child who is less than 12 years of age is properly secured in the rear seat of a vehicle, if possible.

(This means if your child is less than 12 years old and sitting up front, this is against the law).

Here are some recommendations 4-7 Years:

Keep your child in a forward-facing car seat with a harness until he or she reaches the top height or weight limit allowed by your car seat's manufacturer. Once your child outgrows the forward-facing car seat with a harness, it's time to travel in a booster seat, but still in the back seat.

8 - 12 Years:

Keep your child in a booster seat until he or she is big enough to fit in a seat belt properly. For a seat belt to fit properly the lap belt must lie snugly across the upper thighs, not the stomach. The shoulder belt should lie snug across the shoulder and chest and not cross the neck or face. Remember: your child should still ride in the back seat because it's safer there.

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
