Principal's Remarks

Being Present Matters!

Students who miss 2-4 days of school in September are likely to be chronically absent for the year (Owens, 2014). Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing school more than 10% of the time. This means that students who miss 16.5 days of school by the end of the year (for whatever reason excused or unexcused) are considered chronically absent. There is a correlation between student attendance and being successful in school, so we obviously encourage students to attend whenever they are healthy. Being at school allows students to benefit from classroom discussions and develop social skills by being with other classmates. As of September 27th, we have 24 students who met the criteria for being chronically absent. We realize this is a small sample size, but we want parents to be aware that being present in school is important. Periodically, chronically absent students meet the threshold of being truant and this designation sparks additional repercussions in accordance with our school board adopted <u>Truancy Policy</u>. Please do what you can to have your child attend school if they are healthy. Thank you.


