

Child Safety in Cars

The Knox County Sheriff's Department visited the school this week to observe school arrival and how children are seated in vehicles. They will be doing this periodically during the school year at arrival or dismissal. Below is a reminder of the ages for children to be in car seats. The biggest thing to remember is that children under 12 should not be in the front seat of the vehicle unless another spot is unavailable.

Child Safety Seat Quick Reference

Il Maine's laws require children be "Properly Secured". This page is designed to assist in identifying and enforcing child passenger safety laws.

Each section below is concluded with a number in parenthesis. This is the paragraph that follows the offense of Title 29-A section 2081 in order to charge the proper offense. **Fines are located on page 32**.

- A child must ride rear facing until the age of 24 months (2-A)
- A child must ride in a rear facing, or forward facing 5-point harness car seat until they are 55 lbs. (2-B)
- Rear facing car seats can NEVER be installed in front of an active air bag. (2-A)
- Car seat harnesses must be snug. You should not be able to pinch excess harness at child's shoulders. (2-A, 2-B)
- Harness Clip should be at child's armpit level. (2-A, 2-B)
- The harness should be coming out of the car seat's harness slot at or below the child's shoulders while riding rear facing (2-A)
- The harness should be coming out of the car seat's harness slot at or above the child's shoulders while riding facing forward. (2-B)
- The car seat should be installed in the vehicle tightly. The tightness should be checked at the belt path (where belt goes through car seat).
 The car seat should not move more than one-inch side to side or front to back. (2-A, 2-B)
- The car seat needs to be secured to the vehicle using a seat belt or the lower anchors, NOT both. (2-A, 2-B)
- Children must ride in a forward-facing harness seat or a Booster Seat until they are 8 years-of-age, 80 lbs., and 4'9" tall. (3-A)
- Booster seats can only be used with a lap and shoulder belt. (3-A)
- Children must ride in the back seat (when available) until they are 12years-old (3-C)
