

School Superintendent

A primary function of the School Board is to select a Superintendent of Schools. To select a Superintendent, a majority vote of all members of the Board will be required. The Superintendent may be appointed to a contract of up to five years in accordance with the laws of the state of Maine.

The Superintendent will be executive officer of the Board. In addition, under Maine statutes the Superintendent will serve as secretary ex-officio to the Board. The Superintendent will be expected to attend all Board meetings and have the right to speak on all subjects, but shall have no vote.

The Superintendent will administer and supervise the public educational system of the district.

The Superintendent will devote the entire working time to the duties of the position. The Superintendent may, without violation of the provisions of this section, perform educational functions outside the district with the approval of the Commissioner of Education and the Board.
